For Your Safety

Downed Power Line

A power line can fall during a storm or from a vehicle collision with a pole. A downed power line is a life-threatening situation which requires immediate action. If you see a downed power line, stay in your car, warn people away and call 911. Police and fire department personnel are trained to handle this situation until utility company employees arrive to secure the area.



Energy Usage Tips

Follow these tips to lower your energy usage:

- Regularly clean or replace the air filters on your heating or cooling system.
- Manually reduce the setting of the thermostat for a water heater to 120 degrees Fahrenheit unless a higher setting is required for proper operation of a dishwasher.
