Follow these tips to save 10 – 25 percent on your monthly energy bill:

- Set your water heater temperature controls to 120 degrees.
- Set the thermostat to 78 degrees or higher when you're at home during the warmer months.
- Increase the setting to 82-86 degrees when you're sleeping or not at home.
- Vacuum underneath and behind your refrigerator coils.

Energy Tip

If your AC unit is on the ground, keep the area around it clean and free of obstructions to maintain air flow.

Call Before You Dig

If you plan to plant a shrub or tree or hire a professional, remember to call 811 before you dig. It's the law. The depth of utility lines varies and there may be multiple utility lines in a common area. Call two days in advance of digging and a representative will send out someone to mark underground facilities.
